

Oregon High-Need LEAs and Schools PrISM Oregon, 2008-09

PrISM Oregon received a grant through the University/School Partnerships program to fund partial tuition assistance for teachers taking PrISM courses that are employed in accredited Oregon public or private pK-12 schools. Oregon's University/ School Partnership program is funded through Title II-A, and must follow the Title II-A definitions for high-need LEAs (Local Education Agencies). If a school district is not listed below, all of its schools are considered non-high-need according to Title II-A rules, despite the fact that the district may have individual high poverty schools.

A high-need LEA is defined as one in which 20% or more school-aged children are living in poverty according to U.S. Census figures, AND which has 2.5% or more teachers who are not considered highly-qualified according to NCLB definitions.

The prime indicator within a high-need district of individual school poverty that Oregon is using is the percentage of students (40%+) who qualify for free or reduced lunch. If a public pK-12 school is not listed in the following chart, it doesn't meet federal definition requirements and is not considered high-need for tuition assistance reimbursement under the USP program.

To be considered high-need, private pK-12 schools must be within the physical boundaries of one of the high-need districts listed below AND serve significant numbers of high poverty students.

By federal definition, a high-need LEA is a district:

- (A) (i) that serves not fewer than 10,000 children from families with incomes below the poverty line; **or**

- (ii) for which not less than 20% of the children served by the agency are from families with incomes below the poverty line; **and**
- (B) (i) for which there is a high percentage of teachers not teaching in the academic subjects or grade levels that the teachers were trained to teach; **or**
- (ii) for which there is a high percentage of teachers with emergency, provisional, or temporary certification or licensing [NCLB, Section 2102(3)] *

* 2.5% is the cutoff beginning 2006

**Oregon high-poverty school districts
that don't satisfy federal "high-need" definition requirements**

Sixteen additional Oregon LEAs have poverty levels among school-aged children that exceed 20%, however, fewer than 2.5% of the teachers in the district are considered not highly qualified,* so the district is not an eligible high-need LEA according to the federal definition.
