

Oregon High-Need LEAs and Schools – PrISM Oregon project – updated March 2011

2009-10 data (latest available from U.S. Census and state sources)

- A total of 94 Oregon school districts have a poverty level of 20% or more among school-aged children. Fifty-four of the 94 high-poverty school districts also have more than 2.5% of classes taught by non-highly qualified teachers, a requirement for University/School Partnership (Title II-A) grant partners.
- Only the schools listed below qualify as high-need schools under the requirements of the Title II-A University/School Partnerships grants (this includes all USP projects, including PrISM Oregon tuition scholarships). Individual schools in high-poverty districts with fewer than 40% of students qualifying for free/reduced lunch are not considered high-need and are not listed.

A high-need LEA is defined as one in which 20% or more school-aged children are living in poverty according to U.S. Census figures, AND which has 2.5% or more teachers who are not considered highly-qualified according to NCLB definitions. Schools within districts that meet these qualifications that also have at least 40% free/reduced lunch are considered high-need in the PrISM Oregon tuition scholarship project. School districts and the schools in those districts that are not listed on this chart do not qualify as high-need for this project.

Only these districts and their high-need schools (at least 60% F/R lunch) are eligible as partners in University-School Partnership projects (Title II-A), however, other districts can participate along with high-need partners in USP projects.

By federal definition, a high-need LEA is a district:

- (A) (i) that serves not fewer than 10,000 children from families with incomes below the poverty line; **or**
- (ii) for which not less than 20% of the children served by the agency are from families with incomes below the poverty line; **and**
- (B)* (i) for which there is a high percentage of teachers not teaching in the academic subjects or grade levels that the teachers were trained to teach; **or**
- (ii) for which there is a high percentage of teachers with emergency, provisional, or temporary certification or licensing [NCLB, Section 2102(3)]

* 2.5% is the cutoff beginning 2006
